Compliance Checklist for EM.03.01.03

Joint Commission Standard EM.03.01.03 requires organizations to conduct regular emergency exercises that fully evaluate their Emergency Operations (Management) Plans verifying appropriateness, adequacy, and effectiveness. Historically, organizations across all programs struggle to meet this standard's requirements and for the first half of 2014, it has the highest percentage of noncompliance of any Joint Commission standard.

The following checklist distills the EPs in this standard. It's designed to help your organization improve how it tracks emergency exercises and how it evaluates performance on those exercises. You can use it to verify compliance and guide how you conduct your emergency exercises. The tasks on the left apply universally to all settings, unless otherwise indicated in parentheses after the task description.
